### Memorandum of Understanding between Concordia University Wisconsin & Ann Arbor and Siena Heights University

#### I. INTRODUCTION

Concordia University Wisconsin & Ann Arbor (CUWAA), an institution of higher education accredited by the Higher Learning Commission (HLC) and Siena Heights University (SHU), an institution of higher learning accredited by the Higher Learning commission (HLC) have entered into this Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) as of the date of the last signature below.

Concordia University Wisconsin and Ann Arbor will cease offering some programs in a face-to-face format on the Ann Arbor campus at the end of the spring 2025 semester, Sunday, May 4, 2025. The purpose of this MOU is to ensure the equitable treatment of students enrolled in programs on the Ann Arbor campus and to ensure a reasonable opportunity for such students to complete their program of study at SHU. SHU will offer automatic admission to its teach out programs for the Ann Arbor campus students who are eligible as defined below.

#### II. Participation Eligibility

Any student actively enrolled (this includes students who are actively enrolled, but officially on leave) at Concordia University Ann Arbor campus in the spring of 2025 or fall of 2024 semester ("Teach Out Student(s)") shall be a beneficiary of this MOU by enrolling in a program agreed upon by CUWAA and SHU as listed in Exhibit A. CUWAA students who wish to participate in the teach out at SHU must participate in the CUAA comparable program designated by SHU in Exhibit A. Students who wish to attend SHU under a different major/program than that of their CUAA major/program or not eligible for the same Teach Out benefits and will be considered transfer students by SHU.

#### III. Siena Heights University Responsibilities

1. All student credits from the CUWAA Liberal Arts Core will count toward completion of undergraduate degrees and will replace equivalent requirements of Siena Heights' general education curriculum at the undergraduate level. All Teach Out Student credits

- will be accepted toward an equal or comparable degree program at Siena Heights University, as outlined in Exhibit A.
- 2. SHU guarantees admission without application fees to all CUWAA Teach Out Students.
- 3. The pathway to graduation for each qualified Teach Out Student to SHU will allow the Teach Out Student to complete his/her program in the same timeframe as was possible at CUWAA (or sooner).
- 4. SHU will waive its residency requirements (requirement that a certain number of credit hours must be earned at SHU to earn a degree from SHU) for all Teach Out Students under the terms of this MOU.
- 5. All CUWAA completed credit hours for the Teach Out Students will be applied to the appropriate SHU program as detailed in Exhibit A. SHU will transfer in credits from other accredited institutions that were already transferred to CUWAA as part of the students' transcript. Official copies of transcripts from other institutions attended are required.
- 6. SHU will designate two specific points of contact, the Director of Undergraduate Admissions and the Provost & Vice President for Academic Affairs (identified below the signature of SHU) to assist Teach Out Students in answering questions regarding the specific terms of this MOU, including without limitation the charges described in Exhibit B.
- 7. SHU will provide Teach Out Students with academic advising by its professional advising staff and/or full-time faculty, as appropriate.
- 8. SHU will provide the same level of ADA accommodations for Teach Out Students as received from CUWAA. Students or the Academic Resource Center & Accessibility Services of the Ann Arbor campus must provide accommodation letters and documentation to SHU's Accommodations Officer.
- 9. SHU will provide Teach Out Students with financial aid counseling provided by admission and/or financial aid staff. Teach Out Students will be eligible for grants and/or scholarships as outlined in Exhibit B.
- 10. Teach Out Students will be eligible for available on campus housing through SHU at rates outlined in Exhibit B.
- 11. SHU will maintain record of all student Grade Point Equivalencies for their tenure at SHU and will provide documentation for any future graduate application or transfer of credits.

#### IV. Teach Out Student Admission Process

1. Complete the SHU enrollment form online here. No application fee will be assessed for CUWAA students applying to SHU.

- 1. Submit official CUWAA transcripts to SHU. (Official transcripts are to be requested from National Student Clearinghouse. Please send official transcripts to <a href="mailto:admissionsoffice@sienaheights.edu">admissionsoffice@sienaheights.edu</a>. Given that transcripts come from a third-party vendor, there will be a small charge to have transcripts issued.
- 2. Unofficial transcripts may be used to initiate the admission process, but official transcripts are required prior to registering for classes at SHU.
- 3. For International Students In addition to the items listed above, send a copy of your proof of English Proficiency, and proof of funding documents for one year of study to SHU at <a href="mailto:admissionsoffice@sienaheights.edu">admissionsoffice@sienaheights.edu</a>. After admission, international Teach Out Students should request the Designated School Official (DSO) at CUWAA to transfer the Form I-20 to SHU's DSO Bonnie Lynch at <a href="mailto:blynch@sienaheights.edu">blynch@sienaheights.edu</a>.

#### V. Limitations

- 1. The terms of the MOU apply to students who attend SHU and begin enrollment before September 1, 2025. Teach Out Students will be subject to satisfactory academic progress policies of SHU, upon matriculation at SHU.
- 2. Students must maintain their enrollment for the terms of the MOU to apply. Teach Out Students who go on leave or withdraw from the college for any reason will need to return to SHU under SHU's own programs and standard admission procedures.
- 3. SHU reserves the right to amend curriculum included in the teach out agreement with CUWAA based upon external accrediting or licensing requirements.

#### VI. Financial Terms

1. Teach Out Students will be responsible for expenses incurred at SHU as set forth in Exhibit B.

#### VII. Joint Obligations

- 1. Each party will be responsible for notifying their accrediting body or other entities, as necessary, of the existence and terms of this agreement.
- 2. Both parties acknowledge and agree that this MOU will be made available to the public, preferably given to all Ann Arbor campus students via email, website or in-person.

#### VIII. Term

 The term of this MOU shall commence from the date of the last signature to this MOU and continue, Subject to Section V, Limitations, through December 31, 2025, to allow time for CUWAA students to apply to SHU. Notwithstanding the foregoing, the Teach Out Students must matriculate no later than the start of the fall semester 2025 and

- maintain continuous enrollment at SHU in order to remain eligible for the benefits outlined in this MOU.
- 2. After the start of the fall semester 2025, requests for admission of CUWAA students to SHU shall be subject to the then current SHU transfer requirements and financial benefits for new students transferring to SHU, and any enrollment decisions are at the sole discretion of SHU.

#### IX. Miscellaneous

- 1. Nothing contained herein shall imply any partnership, joint venture or agency relationship between the parties and neither party shall have the power to obligate or bind the other in any manner except to the extent herein provided.
- This MOU may be amended only by a written agreement signed by both parties.
   Notwithstanding the previous statement, SHU reserves the right to amend its programs, policies, and procedures. Such changes will be reflected in the SHU Catalog.
- 3. A facsimile or PDF signature shall be deemed an original for purposes of evidencing execution of this MOU. The signatories to this MOU represent and warrant that each has the right and authority to execute this MOU in their individual or representative capacity, as applicable.
