

Transfer Opportunities for Ann Arbor Students between Concordia University Wisconsin & Ann Arbor and University of Illinois Springfield

I. INTRODUCTION

Concordia University Wisconsin & Ann Arbor (CUWAA), an institution of higher education accredited by the Higher Learning Commission (HLC) and University of Illinois Springfield (UIS), an institution of higher learning accredited by the Higher Learning Commission (HLC) have outlined transfer opportunities for students currently enrolled on the Concordia University Ann Arbor campus.

The University of Illinois Springfield will offer waiver of application fees when applying to the institution. Additionally, upon receipt of student transcripts, the UIS admissions team will expedite evaluations and will accept as many credits as possible, as allowed by university policies. Students who are entering transfer programs will need to meet University of Illinois Springfield's admission requirements. Exhibit A of this document outlines programs where transfer opportunities exist. Students are subject to the transfer requirements of UIS.

II. Transferring Student Admission Process

1. Complete the University of Illinois Springfield Application at <https://www.uis.edu/apply>.
2. Request all official transcripts to be sent to UIS. Transcripts must be delivered from the sending institution(s) to UIS directly via Parchment, National Clearinghouse, or emailed from the Registrar's office to incomingtranscripts@uis.edu.
 - a. UIS will only accept official transcripts directly from the sending institution(s), we will not accept unofficial transcripts or official transcripts sent by the applicant. All institutions a student has attended must be received by UIS before the application can be evaluated. Any questions about this can be directed to REGISTRAR@uis.edu or admprocessing@uis.edu.
3. For International Students: In addition to the items listed above, we may need an official English Proficiency Exam (please see <https://www.uis.edu/international-applicants/english-proficiency-requirements> for the accepted exam proctors, needed scores, and FAQ's on exemption eligibility) and official Transcript/Credential evaluation from a UIS accepted NACES member or by paying the \$150 non-refundable in-house credential evaluation fee. 4. After admission, International Transferring Students should work with their Designated School Official (DSO) and the Office of International Student Services (ISS) at UIS (<https://www.uis.edu/iss>) to organize any necessary Form I-20 and Visa documentation.
