CONCORDIA UNIVERSITY ANN ARBOR, Athlete Graduation Rates Posted in compliance with the Equity in Athletics Disclosure Act March 2018

IPEDS-defined cohorts of first-time, full-time freshmen were used for Fall 2010 and Fall 2011, to provide data for six year graduation rates as of 08/31/17 and 08/31/17, respectively. These two years were combined, due to CUAA's small N's.

The data used included:

- First-time, full-time FR for Fall 2010 and Fall 2011
- Athletic financial aid data for the relevant semesters (based on previously obtained PowerFAIDS data.
- Graduation dates from both PowerCAMPUS and Banner, in a combined database.

NOTE: Athletic financial aid was used as a proxy for rostered athletes, because the only available athlete data were eligibility reports, downloaded from NAIA, in which students' unique identifiers were often missing and nicknames were used rather than full names. As a result, the financial aid data seemed the best indicator of students who should be included in this summary.

N's:

- 280 unique students within the relevant three fall semester were first-time, full-time freshmen.
- 196 of those students had athletically-related financial aid, according to the PowerFAIDS download.

Note: It is common for students to play more than one sport over the course of the academic year. However, for the purposes of this summary, team membership was counted only for the sport in which the student was listed as receiving aid for their first Fall enrollment.

Results: The results are summarized below by demographics and by sport. The results show no difference between the graduation rates for athletes and CUAA overall. There is, however, a marked gender difference, with women having a much higher graduation rate for these cohorts than did men (49% vs. 23%). This especially significant difference is likely due in part to the fact that CUAA, during 2010 and 2011, began a football program, which is now established and performing well.
